So, what is Rally?

According to the American Kennel Club (AKC), Rally is a sport that emphasizes fun, teamwork, and clear communication between handler and dog. In Rally, you and your dog navigate a course together, side-by-side, completing a series of obedience exercises at numbered signs along the way.

Some signs ask for basics like sits, downs, and heeling, while others challenge you with more advanced maneuvers like 360° turns, sidesteps, or recalls. The course is timed, but accuracy and teamwork are key-you can talk to your dog throughout the entire course, making it a supportive and encouraging experience for teams of all skill levels.

Why try Rally?

- It's a great way to build a stronger bond with your dog.
- Rally offers a friendly entry point into the world of competitive dog sports.
- It's suitable for dogs of all ages and breeds, including senior dogs and beginners.
- You'll join a welcoming community of handlers who love working with their dogs.

Whether you're a seasoned handler or new to the sport, we'd love to see more of our members give Rally a try! Training is fun and accessible, and many of our club members are happy to mentor newcomers.

The Training Corner — ABCD Drills

What are they: 4-5 marks designed to present several marking concepts in a drill-like environment. The lines to the marks are tight, the fall areas are close together, and distances are relatively short, with all gun stations visible.

Why we run them

- To practice marking concepts in a controlled, drill-like setting.
- To improve a dog's ability to slide tight past a gunner en route to another mark.
- To help dogs focus on keeping hunts tight in the fall area.
- To teach awareness of mark depth.
- To give dogs experience picking out gun stations in tight setups.

What each mark in this ABCD drill teaches:

- **Long Single**: Encourages your dog to focus on longer marks despite closer, more visually appealing gun stations.
- **Check-Down Bird**: This bird falls directly in line with thrower #3, which might draw your dog deep.
- **Mid-Distance Mark**: Teaches the dog to avoid stopping short in the old fall at #2 while also resisting going deep to #5.
- **Hip Pocket**: Requires the dog to slide tight past thrower #2 & **Equidistant**: avoid the risk of switching to other nearby fall areas (#1 or #5).
- **Hip Pocket**: Another chance to practice sliding tight past a gun station en-route to the mark



Training Tip:

Incorporate ABCD drills into your program several times a month. Regular exposure to these setups helps your dog understand fall areas, stay organized in their hunts, and improve their marking skills. It also builds confidence in tight marking situations, sharpens your ability to read your dog, and strengthens communication.— *The Retriever Coach*
