2019 New Title Rosettes for MFGRC Members

Members of the Mid-Florida Golden Retriever Club who earn new titles for their Goldens during calendar year 2019 may be eligible to receive a new title rosette from the club. The rosettes will be similar to this one from 2018 being modeled by Ralph and Maria Orlando's Golden boy Smokey:



This year a stipulation has been added to the process: in order to be eligible to receive a new title rosette from the club, a member must have volunteered to work for at least one club event during the year, or have done equivalent work for the club behind-the-scenes (subject to verification). The stipulation was added to encourage members to help with club events.

If your dog has won a new title in 2019 and you feel you are eligible to receive a rosette, please email the full name of the dog, what the title earned was and what event(s) you worked at to MFGRC board member Robin Burket. Robin will order the rosettes later this year and make them available for pickup early next year. If you will not be able to attend an event to pick up your rosette, you will be asked to send a check for \$10 for postage and handling, made out to MFGRC, so that it can be mailed to you. 
And of course my wife Barbara Hall was again a huge help to me during the months leading up to the trial and on that weekend. Thanks to her and to everyone.

Diane and Vern Gank of Wonderland's Golden Retrievers have donated a new perpetual trophy that they will present to the winning owner of the MFGRC Show Dog of the Year. The special award will be in addition to the club's award of a custom car magnet to the winner.

All of the club's year-end awards will be presented at the club's Christmas party and annual meeting, which this year will be December 14 at the home of club president Ann Rowe in Sorrento, FL.

In addition to Show Dog of the Year, the MFGRC presents year-end awards to the Agility Dog of the Year, Field Dog of the Year, Obedience Dog of the Year, Rally Dog of the Year and Tracking Dog of the Year. The club also presents the Versatility Award and the Fallchase Owner-Handler Award.

To be eligible for any of the club's year-end awards, a club member must have attended one club general meeting and volunteered at two club functions during the awards period (or performed the equivalent work behind-the-scenes).

The awards are determined by a point system that varies amongst the different categories. Club members are responsible for filling out and submitting their own entry forms by the entry deadline.

The entry form for the year-end awards will be sent to club members in October.



Create an indoor potty place

During active hurricanes it may be unsafe to let the dogs outside for a potty break. Inclement weather could last for more than 24-48 hours. Be prepared with an indoor potty place.

Create your indoor potty place with trays of grass plugs or a few pieces of sod which you can get from a local nursery or at the garden supply department at Lowes or Home Depot. Just place grass on top of a tarp or put grass in a kiddie pool. Locate your dog's potty place in the garage or covered porch.
